President's Report for 50th Annual General Meeting

Can you believe it, DATA celebrated its 50th anniversary this year, what a great achievement. How quickly another year passes. Once again, I would like to thank all the committee members past and present and the volunteers for their continued efforts and support.

DATA has continued to sponsor The Ron Jones Education Award and Filter Your Future. In addition, the Grant a Dream For Kidney Kids programme was set up this year to help make hospital stays more pleasant for children on Dialysis. We provided the following this year:

1 PC for a teenager on haemodialysis at Royal Children's Hospital Dialysis Unit, to help with his studies at Virtual School Victoria

2 iPads for Monash Children's Dialysis Unit, 1 iPad for the actual unit to distract children while a procedure is being performed on them & 1 iPad for a 13-year-old girl on Peritoneal Dialysis The Sue Hatzimichalis post graduate Nursing Scholarship, 2 nurses were sponsored in the last year.

This year's recipients were-Maryam Rezakhani from Austin Health and Kate Gale from Grampians Health. For 2024 – the scholarship has been offered to Austin Health, Grampians Health & Royal Melbourne Hospital

DATA has donated \$2000 for the maintenance of the Purple Truck. The Purple Truck is a self-contained dialysis unit on wheels which travels to remote communities to assist indigenous communities with renal issues.

DATA has 2 holiday homes, one in Rosebud and one in Yarrawonga. These holiday homes are rented at a highly subsidised rate to members with priority given to those on Dialysis. Rosebud was used for 26 weeks and Yarrawonga for 31 weeks. A thank you to the members who have donated household items and equipment to the houses.

Vale Michael Oakley 1946—2023



Although he has not been on the committee for many years, he enjoyed reading Shoestring and remained interested in DATAs progress.

When Ron Jones, founding member of DATA passed away in 1985, The Ron Jones Memorial Trust Fund was set up. Michael was a key member to raise funds for the Trust Fund.

Michael was born on 8th November 1946 and passed away on 24th September 2023. He was just shy of being 77 years old.

He married Christine in 1970. They have two daughters - Nicole and Amanda. Christine and Michael have 4 grandchildren aged between 11 - 14.



Type 2 Diabetes in Children

Children as young as four have been diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes as doctors raise alarm at 'exponential trend'

Doctors have issued an urgent plea for national intervention to stem the rising tide of Type 2 diabetes diagnoses in children and young people, warning patients are suffering heart attacks as young as 25 and some are expected to reach end-stage renal failure by the age of 30.

The medics have revealed Type 2 diabetes has been diagnosed in children as young as the age of four in northern Australia in what they describe as an "exponential trend" of increase in the disease in young people on a scale which has never

FYF is part of Healthy Kidneys Education Project which has been sponsored by DATA since 2017. The project aims to tackle the rising tide of obesity, type 2 diabetes and associated cardiovascular diseases with a focus of preventable chronic kidney disease.

It is essentially aimed at primary school aged children, as they will be the ones to go home and speak with their parents about what they have learnt at school. It teaches the children how to keep healthy, that water is an excellent drink option and how much sugar is in processed food and drinks.

It is so important to keep up the good work of Yvonne Farquharson from FYF, to show children that some chronic diseases such as type 2 diabetes are preventable.

Once again we sit before you with the news that all assets are secure (the Term Deposits are now sitting in the best rates for many years, the Holiday Homes are stable with the aim of renovating Rosebud) and the day to day activities have complied with our DATA Rules of assisting and supporting members affected by renal disease.

In reference to the Financial Report:

Our Revenue Stream viewed on pages 3 & 12. In comparison 2022 vs 2023 figures only down by \$5,000. The holiday houses rental income has continued to increase, which minimised the decrease in donations, the Term Deposit interest received and not holding our yearly AGM raffle.

Due to changes in our Committee's time and working commitments, along with those who have passed away during last year as well as those who are planning to retire/resign, we will need to rely more on office contractors to ensure we can complete basic office work as we move forward. If you know of anyone who has the skills and would like to apply as a paid contractor in the office, please let us know. Alternatively, reliable volunteers are also welcome.

In reference to the Management Letter:

Saward Dawson Review focuses on the correctness and the movements in income and expenditures, the completeness of income, and the accuracy of the fixed assets register.

There was an adjustment made to capture the movement in fair value of

both properties to present a more accurate indication of our properties values.

As a Not For Profit organisation following our DATA Rules and engaging an outside Audit Company to annually check our operating business, we are consistently following current business guidelines.

We welcome the <u>Saward Dawson ideas</u> and <u>suggestions for improvement:</u>
Risk Management, IT Controls, Related Parties Policy, and the Governance Standards in relation to Child and Vulnerable Peoples Safety.

Ongoing Business improvements identified by Us.

Better Term Deposit Interest rates offered by Bendigo Bank.
We will still maintain ANZ for day to day transactions but use Bendigo Bank for the money growth.

In future, our Term deposits returns will allow DATA to show a break even rather than deficit financial year turnover.

This, of course, could fluctuate as we are constantly expanding who we assist/help to the benefit of people experiencing renal disease impact in their lives.

We will also be looking at Rosebud House renovations/refurbishment to improve member comforts and asset appreciation.

Filter Fun Park promotional videos completed

A 5-minute video of the Musical can now be viewed on the Filter Your Future website along with the completed Sugar Song with animations. The website has been updated with feedback provided by some of the attendees from the four shows which launched Filter Fun Park The Musical in May at the Floridia Club in Flemington. Results have been collated to evaluate the effectiveness of the musical to promote positive lifestyle changes. For the Foundation to Grade 4 students, 82% stated they would try harder to avoid sugary drinks. For the Grade 5-6 students, 96% recorded they would drink more water; 74% would eat less junk food; 90% would exercise more; and, 73% indicated they will ask their parents to make healthier lifestyle choices.

Ongoing costs to keep the lessons online
