#### Monash Children's

Monash Children's Hospital (MCH) Dialysis Unit had 9 children on dialysis (haemo and peritoneal) in November 2023.

The Nurse Unit Manager (NUM) of the Paediatric Dialysis Unit is Yogi Jeyakumar. She has been working at Monash Medical Centre (MMC) for more than 30 years, caring for children and adults on haemodialysis, peritoneal dialysis and transplant.

It has been some time since our last newsletter after we have all endured the extended COVID-19 lockdowns, the isolation periods and inevitable recovery required and it is now time to review where we are at as a group.

As successful as the group has been over many years, the participation numbers have unfortunately dwindled over time and along with the residual effects of the pandemic and its intrusion into all our lives, has sadly lead us to decide that it is no longer viable to continue with the support group. The current President, Secretary and Treasurer will be resigning their positions after many years of dedicated service but we welcome interest from any parties who may wish to step-up and renew/reform the group moving forward.

We welcome your input.

At this point in time however, if there is no new interest in continuing with the support group, it is intended that the bank account be closed and the funds be donated to a national renal support group such as Kidney Health Australia.

The Sunraysia Dialysis & Transplant Support Group has been a vital link for all of us since it commenced in the 1970's providing valuable face to face contact, support by sharing information, friendship and connections with like minded people.

Most support needs for patients and their carers are now being catered for by Dialysis Unit at Mildura Base Public Hospital and/ or relevant Melbourne/Adelaide City Hospitals. Chronic illness counselling for patients and families is offered by these medico's and although respite for carers and holiday placements are limited, Kidney Health Australia assistance is available.

They provide a valuable connection to help ensure families in our community that are having to deal with emotional, physical and financial impacts of kidney disease can get the care and support they need.

There is abundant information available online for all facets of Kidney disease or Transplantation and/or their complications and care, with technology like Telehealth enabling us to connect with our Doctors and Specialists in a personalised manner without all the travel hassles.

Using V.P.T.A.S. (Victorian Patient Transport Assistance Service) helps reimburse most of the costs for transport and accommodation expenses when you do have to travel to a major hospital for treatment.

Locally SIRS (Sunraysia Information & Referral Service) can assist with completing the necessary

paperwork.


